All elements of the Combat Team left the U.S. for overseas duty on 3 May 44, except the 1st Bn 442d Inf, which remained at home station.

All as per Sec V, GO 132, Headquarters Fifth Army, 2 August 1944.

442d RCT detached from 34th Infantry Division. 100th Bn attached IV Corps, 442d Infantry to II Corps, 85th Division, per telegram Hq II Corps, 13 August 1944.

442d RCT (less 100th Bn) detached from 85th Division, attached to 88th Infantry Division effective 181200 Aug 44, per letter Hq II Corps, 17 August 1944, Subject: Operations.

Effective 1200 6 Sept 44, the 442d RCT was detached from the 88th Infantry Division and reverted to II Corps control. Effective upon arrival at Castiglioncello, Italy (6 Sept 44) the 442d RCT was detached from II Corps and reverted to Fifth Army control. Above changes directed by II Corps Staff Message, dated 5 Sept 44, to Commanding General, 88th Division and Commanding Officer, 442d RCT.

Effective upon arrival at Castiglioncello, Italy (7 Sept 44) 100th Bn, 442d Infantry detached from Task Force No. 45 and reverts to control of parent unit, per Memorandum No. 46, Task Force No. 45, 5 Sept 44.

Effective upon arrival at Naples, Italy (12 Sept 44) the 442d RCT detached from Fifth Army, and assigned to Seventh Army, and attached to NATOUSA for administration and to SOS NATOUSA for supply, in accordance with secret letter AG 370.5-Y, Headquarters Fifth Army, 5 Sept 44.

Sent out patrols to Sesto and San Martino, approximately six kilometres North of the Arno. Directed artillery fire on enemy defensive positions, cleared minefields in regimental sector.
