AWARDS AND DECORATIONS - MONTH OF OCTOBER 1944

AWARDS, POSTHUMOUS, OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS. (GO 153, Hq 5th Army, 23 Sept 44)

KAZUO OTANI (39089432). Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 15 July 44, near Pieve di S. Luce, Italy. Advancing to attack a hill objective, Staff Sergeant OTANI'S platoon became pinned down in a wheatfield by concentrated fire from enemy machine gun and sniper positions. Realizing the danger confronting his platoon, Staff Sergeant OTANI exposed himself to enemy fire to shoot a sniper who was firing with deadly effect upon his men. Then, followed by a steady stream of machine gun bullets, Staff Sergeant OTANI dashed across the open wheatfield toward the foot of a cliff. From this point, he directed his men to crawl to the cover of the cliff. When the movement of the platoon drew heavy enemy fire, he dashed along the cliff toward the left flank, occasionally exposing himself and firing his submachine gun to draw enemy fire from his men. By attracting the attention of the enemy he enabled the men closest to the cliff to reach cover. Organizing these men to guard against possible enemy counterattack, Staff Sergeant OTANI again made his way across the open field, shouting instructions to the stranded men while enemy bullets followed him. Reaching the rear of the platoon position, he took partial cover in a shallow ditch and directed covering fire for the men who had begun to move forward by leaps and bounds. At this time one of his men became seriously wounded. Ordering his men to remain under cover, Staff Sergeant OTANI crawled to the wounded soldier who was lying on open bround in full view of the enemy. Dragging the wounded soldier to a shallow ditch. Staff Sergeant OTANI proceeded to render first aid treatment but was mortally wounded by machine gun fire. The dauntless courage and inspiring leadership exhibited by Staff Sergeant OTANI exemplify the highest traditions of the Armed Forces of the United States. Next of kin: Yoichi Otani, Rivers, Arizona.

TOGO S. SUGIYAMA (39163051), Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 12 July 1944, near Pastina, Italy. To support a company attack, Sergeant SUGIYAMA emplaced his machine gun on the crest of a saddle between two hills so that his fire could cover the forward slope of both hills. Then, exposed to grazing small arms fire, he crawled along the ridge to a commanding position in order to direct fire. Locating an enemy machine gun and snipers on the left flank, Sergeant SUGIYAMA made his way along the reverse slope of the hill and reached a point directly opposite the enemy weapon. He killed two snipers with rifle fire and forced the machine gunners to withdraw. Returning to his observation post, he located a dugout occupied by two mipers who were firing on his machine gun position. Securing several grenades he led three riflemen in attacking the dugout to kill one German and force the other to surrender. Later, Sergeant SUGIYAMA fired tracer bullets to designate a German machine gun position, to enable nearby riflemen to neutralize a German machine gun position. After reporting to nearby riflemen the presence of enemy troops located in a concrete house, Sergeant SUGIYAMA observed two German squads approaching the forward slope of the left hill. Crawling to a position of better visibility, and exposing himself to enemy fire, Sergeant SUGIYAMA fired three rifle grenades to kill five Germans and force the remainder to flee. Another machine gun across the valley opened fire on him, but withdrew before he could return fire. As he started to crawl back to his squad, Sergeant SUGIYAMA was fired upon by a concealed machine gun. Rising to return the fire,

Sergeant SUGIYAMA was killed instantly. By his fearlessness, combat skill and initiative, Sergeant SUGIYAMA inflicted heavy casualties upon the enemy, and inspired his men by his intrepidity and self-sacrificing devotion to duty. Next of kin: Mr. Franklin Sugiyama (Brother), Sweetmine, Utah.

KIICHI KODA, (30101862), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 9 July 1944, near Castellina, Italy. Reaching a point fifty yards from its objective, Private First Class KODA'S platoon received a volley of German machine gun and machine pistol fire from a wooded area. Private First Class KODA, accompanied by four comrades with fixed bayonets, charged into the woods. Firing their rifles from the hip whenever they spotted an enemy position, he and his comrades completely disrupted and disorganized the Germans in the area. Completing his mission, Private First Class KODA rejoined his squad which had been ordered to flank and guard a castle, the objective of an adjacent company. The enemy opened fire on the platoon with machine guns. Sensing the danger of a possible German attack, Private First Class KODA requested permission from his platoon leader to capture the castle. Instructing his comrades to cover his approach, he moved forward to a point five yards from the castle. Spotting an open window, he tossed a grenade into the building; then crept to each successive window, repeating the operation until he had completely circled the structure. Rejoining his squad, Private First Class Koda led his comrades with fixed bayonets into the castle. In the ensuing fight Private First Class KODA was mortally wounded by an enemy hand grenade; but as a result of his intrepid performance, three prisoners were captured, ten Germans killed, and five machine guns and four machine pistols were taken. Private First Class KODA'S fearless courage and fighting spirit were an inspiration to his fellow soldiers and serve as an example of the heroic traditions of the Army of the United States. Entered military service from Waipahu, Oahu, T. H. Next of kin: Mrs. Shizu Koda (Mother), Waipahu, Oahu, T.H.

KIYOSHI K. MURANAGA, (37356488), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 26 June 1944, near Suvereto, Italy. Private First Class MURANAGA'S company encountered a strong enemy force in commanding positions and with superior fire power. An enemy 88mm self-propelled gun opened direct fire on the company, causing the men to disperse and seek cover. The mortar squad in which Private First Class MURANAGA served as gunner was ordered to action, but the terrain made it impossible to set up the weapon in defilade. The squad leader realizing the vulnerability of the mortar position, moved his men away from the gun to positions of comparative safety. Because of the heavy casualties being inflicted on his company, Private First Class MURANAGA elected to attempt to neutralize the 88mm weapon alone. Voluntarily remaining at his gun position, Private First Class MURANAGA manned the mortar himself and opened fire on the enemy gun at a range of approximately four hundred yards. With his third round he was able to correct his fire so that the shell landed directly in front of the enemy gun. Meanwhile, the German crew immediately aware of the source of the mortar fire, had turned the 88mm weapon directly on Private First Class MURANAGA'S position. Before Private First Class MURANAGA could fire a fourth round, an 88mm shell scored a direct hit on his position, killing him instantly. Because of the accuracy of Private First Class MURANAGA'S previous fire, the Germans decided not to risk further exposure and immediately abandoned their position. Private First Class MURANAGA'S courageous performance typifies the fines traditions of the Armed Forces of the United States. Next of kin: Mrs. Kikuyo Muranaga (Mother) Ameche, Colorado.

WILLIAM K. NAKAMURA (39918272), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 4 July 1944, near Castellina, Italy During a bitterly contested fire fight, Private First Class NAKAMURA'S platoon became pinned down by enemy machine gun fire from a concealed position. On his own initiative Private First Class NAKAMURA crawled twenty yards toward the hostile nest while fire from the enemy machine gun barely cleared his body. Reaching a point fifteen yards from the position, he quickly raised himself to a kneeling position and threw four hand grenades in rapid succession, killing or wounding at least three of the German crew. The weapon silenced, Private First Class NAKAMURA crawled back to his platoon, which was able to continue its advance as a result of his courageous action. Later, his company was ordered to withdraw from the crest of a hill so that a mortar barrage could be placed on the ridge to neutralize heavy small arms fire. On his own initiative, Private First Class NAKAMURA remained in position to cover his comrades' withdrawal. While moving toward the safety of a wooded draw, his platoon became pinned down by accurate machine gun fire. Crawling to a point from which fire could be placed on the German position, Private First Class NAKAMURA rapidly and accurately fired clip after clip of ammunition to pin down the enemy machine gunners. His platoon was able to withdraw to safety without further casualties. Private First Class NAKAMURA was killed as a result of his heroic stand. His courageous deeds, performed with soldierly skill, reflect the highest traditions of the Army of the United States. Next of kin: Mr George T. Nakamura (Father), Hunt, Idaho.

AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS (GO 153, Hq 5th Army 23 Sept 44)

KAORU MOTO, (30101272), Private First Class, Infantry, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in action, on 7 July 1944, near Castellina, Italy. While serving as first scout of a squad, Private First Class MOTO observed a machine gun nest which was holding up the progress of his platoon. On his own initiative he made his way to a point ten paces from the hostile position, shot and killed the German machine gunner with his rifle. Immediately, the assistant gunner opened fire in the direction of Private First Class MOTO. Crawling to the rear of the position, Private First Class MOTO surprised the German, who quickly surrendered. Taking his prisoner with him, Private First Class MOTO took up a position a few yards from a house to deny the enemy use of the building as an observation post. While guarding the house and his prisoner, he observed a German machine gun section moving into position. His deadly fire forced the enemy to withdraw. An enemy sniper located in another house fired At Private First Class MOTO, severely wounding him. Applying first aid to his wound, he changed position to elude the sniper fire. Private First Class MOTO continued to harass the enemy and enabled his platoon to continue its advance. Finally relieved of his position by the arrival of a squad, he made his way to the rear for treatment. Crossing a road, he spotted a German machine gun nest. Opening fire, he wounded two of the three Germans occupying the position. Not satisfied with this accomplishment he crawled forward to a better position and ordered the Germans to surrender. Receiving no answer, Private First Class MOTO fired two shots at the position, and the Germans surrendered. Private First Class MOTO'S exceptional courage, initiative and determination to destroy the enemy inspired confidence in his fellow soldiers, and his performance reflects the finest traditions of the Army of the United States. Entered military service from Spreckelsville, Maui, T. H.



AWARD OF LEGION OF MERIT (Ltr Hq NATOUSA AG 201-P-Singles, Gordon (Off), 13 Sept 44.

GORDON SINGLES, 0-18522, Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry, 100th Infantry Battalion, 442d Infantry Regiment, for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services in Italy from 15 April to 10 August 1944. As Commanding Officer of the 100th Infantry Battalion (Separate), Lieutenant Colonel Singles exhibited skilful and aggressive leadership in leading his troops in the successful drive on the city of ROME and the subsequent rapid advance up the Italian peninsula. He commanded a task force in an operation which spearheaded a break-through to Rome and greatly expedited the final liberation of the city itself. In the action near BELVEDRE, Italy, he quickly planned and vigorously executed an operation which resulted in the complete destruction of the right flank position of the German Army, inflicting heavy losses upon the enemy and facilitating the rapid advance of an Infantry division in the sector. Lieutenant Colonel Singles then led his troops in capturing and exploiting the capture of several towns which led to the fall of the important town of LECHORN. Throughout the action before Rome and the subsequent rout of the enemy, Lieutenant Colonel Singles displayed exceptional comprehension of the tactical situation at all times, absolute devotion to duty and skilful handling of his troops. His performance was a material factor in perpetuating the 100th Infantry Battalion's reputation as an effective, hard-hitting and well-disciplined combat unit. Entered United States Military Academy from Denver, Colorado.

AWARD, POSTHUMOUS, OF SILVER STAR (GO 153, Hq 5th Army, 23 Sept 44)

ROBERT M. TAKEO, (30100574), Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action, on 6 July 1944, near Castellina, Italy. During a dawn attack, Staff Sergeant TAKEO'S squad was given the mission of securing the exposed right flank of his platoon. While he led his men toward the assigned position, a force of approximately fifty Germans, armed with machine guns, machine pistols and rifles, and supported by mortar fire, launched a counterattack. Directing his men to follow him, Staff Sergeant TAKEO crawled forward exposed to heavy machine gun and sniper fire. Advancing toward the enemy he was shot in the right arm by a sniper. Without stopping for first aid, Staff Sergeant TAKEO continued his advance in the face of deadly enemy fire and reached a vantage point, where he located the positions of the sniper and the machine gun. Inspired by his coolness, his men followed him, crawled to his side and formed a firing line. While designating the locations of the enemy to his men, Staff Sergeant TAKEO was mortally wounded. In the ensuing engagement, his men knocked out the sniper and machine gun nest and opened fire on the approaching enemy. Despite his wounds, Staff Sergeant TAKEO fired his sub-machine gun at the enemy until his death. Inspired by the courage of their leader, his men fought with determination and successfully repulsed the counterattack. Staff Sergeant TAKEO'S intrepidity and indomitable fighting spirit are exemplary of the finest traditions of the Armed Forces of the United States. AWARD OF SILVER STAR (GO 98, Hq 34th Infantry Division, 19 Sept 44)

JIMMIE KANAYA (19020945) Staff Sergeant, Medical Department, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 5 July 1944, in the vicinity of Castellina, Italy. When the Battalion to which Sgt Kanaya was attached as medical aid man was subjected to an intense artillery and mortar barrage, nine men from one of the companies were seriously wounded. In spite of the concentrated machine gun fire, Sgt Kanaya, with utter disregard for his own personal safety, crawled to the wounded soldiers and rapidly and efficiently rendered first-aid to them for a period of two and one-half hours until every man had been properly cared for. The extreme courage and devotion to his comrades displayed by Sgt Kanaya was exemplary and a credit to himself and his organization. Entered military service from Portland, Oregon.

AWARD OF SILVER STAR (GO 110, Hq 34th Infantry Division, 21 Oct 44)

GORDON YAMASHIRO (30105540), Staff Sergeant, Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 17 July 1944, in the vicinity of Luciana, Italy. When an enemy machine gun nest in a building pinned down and halted the advance of his platoon during the attack on Luciana, Sgt Yamashiro on his own initiative ran diagonally across the machine gun's sector of fire with the intention of knocking it out with a hand grenade. Enemy bullets missed him by inches and as he reached a corner of the building enemy snipers opened up on him. Undeterred, Sgt Yamashiro threw a hand grenade through the window, killing two and wounding three of the enemy and wiping out the machine gun nest. Sgt Yamashiro's aggressiveness and daring broke a one-hour stalemate and led to the capture of Luciana itself later that evening. Entered military service from Honolulu, T. H.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (GO 98, Hq 34th Infantry Division, 19 Sept 44)

JIMMIE KANAYA (19020945), Staff Sergeant, Medical Department, Medical Detachment, 442d Infantry Regt. For heroic achievement in action on 16, 17 and 18 July 1944, in the vicinity of Luciana, Italy. Entered military service from Portland, Oregon.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (GO 105, Hq 7th Army, 4 Nov 44)

RODNEY FUKUI, 30104690, Technician Fifth Grade, Medical Corps, Medical Detackment, 442d Infantry. For heroic achievement on 20 October 1944, near Bruyeres, France. Entered military service from Honolulu, T. H.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (GO 108, Hq 34th Infantry Division, 17 Oct 44)

JAMES ABE (19081429), Private, Infantry, Hq Co, 100th Bn, 442d Inf Regt. For heroic achievement in action on 3 July 44, in the vicinity of Castellina, Italy. Entered military service from Seal Beach, California.

STANLEY I. AOTAKI (30105874), Private First Class, Infantry, Company K, 442d Inf Regt. For heroic achievement in action on 7 July 44 in the vicinity of Molino A Ventoabbto, Italy. Entered military service from Iahaina, Maui, T. H.

JAMES K. KUBOKAWA (30101142), Private First Class, Infantry, Hq Co, 100th Bn, 442d Inf Regt. For heroic achievement in action on 5 July 44 in the vicinity of Castellina, Italy. Entered military service from Honolulu, T. H.
